

The Sleeping Tree by the Porch

Today, I want to begin by telling you the story of the sleeping tree beside my back porch.

There was a tree laying beside my back porch with some of its limbs draped across the railing as if the tree was just lying their resting. And I say the tree was asleep their because no one in the house (not my husband, my father or Mother nor the children) heard the tree fall. And this is not a baby tree but a well established rooted and grounded tree.

Later in the evening, my husband and dad cut the remaining part of the tree down, chopped it up for firewood and left a portion of the tree. If you have ever had a tree cut down, you know you must call a stump grinder to completely remove the tree. Which is to cut the tree as close to the ground as possible and grind the roots. So, I believe this testimony was given to me to give to you because we never

called a stump grinder. Had we called one, I would not be able to give you this story.

Now, during the winter we used the cut wood for firewood. Some of it is still in the backyard now. Some of the limbs were used as kindle and buildup for the garden bed. Later in the year as spring came, I noticed that what was left of the tree started sprouting new leaves. As I walk out to the garden today, the tree is has received a new set of limbs and leaves. Although the tree is somewhat laying on the ground, the new growth is taller than me when I put my hands in the air. Part of the root is out of the ground and part of the root is in the ground. The tree is growing and living. I don't know what will become of the tree but for now the tree is alive. Which brings me to why we need to be rooted?

We just make constant change until we become like our eternal Father. Don't you want to go back to God and say see Lord look the seeds that were planted which came from my tree. Don't you want to be rooted? Don't you want that kind of testimony?

You who are of Christ reading this story are the forest. Like the tree in my back yard, part of the roots/foliage reach for the light and the other part stays rooted. We too must continue to reach for Christ to stay rooted. While reaching towards the light with one hand the other hand must lean in to form shelter for others. In a forest or wooded area, trees stand next to each other. Some of the branches begin to intertwine. Not only do we provide support for one another, but we also house the least of these, the sparrows, insects, other birds, rabbits, chipmunks, squirrels, and other animals.

We provide a lil hide away from the wolves. We provide a lil coverage from the storm so that the littles members don't get so wet. They may get wet, but they won't feel the full brunt of the storm. We as deeply rooted saints provide encouragement, love, motivation, shelter, comfort, and a leaning post for other members. More members are coming. The storms will intensify.
